<p>Research 'The Great Fire of London' using the internet or books. Design your own information poster about the Great Fire of London. Challenge: Work out relevant and most important facts to include</p>	<p>The fire started in a bakery. With the help of an adult, you could make bread or cakes which would have been made in the bakery. Take photos to share with the class!</p>	<p>Pretend you are a news reporter in 1666. Write a newspaper report describing the event. Challenge: What could you use to make your newspaper report look old?</p>
<p>Create a picture showing a scene from London during the Great Fire. You could draw, paint, collage, use chalks or use a computer paint package to create your picture.</p>	<h3 style="text-align: center;">What happened in the Great Fire of London?</h3> 	<p>We have been practising our numbers to 100. Can you make your own number line to help you practise? Challenge: Can you count forwards and backwards.</p>
<p>Draw a picture or make a model to show how you would have redesigned the city following the Great Fire. You could use your knowledge from our science topic 'materials' to decide what to use to build the new homes. Challenge: add labels to show London landmarks</p>		<p>Practise your handwriting remembering which letters should be taller or longer. Can you think of a word starting with each letter of the alphabet which links to the Great Fire of London?</p>
<p>Listen to and learn the song 'London's burning'. Challenge: If you feel brave, practise, perform and record it or sing to the class!</p>	<p>Use online game hit the button https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button to improve the speed of your number bond knowledge. (make 10, 20 or 100) Challenge: Move on to try your times tables 5's and 10's.</p>	<p>Make your own quiz about the Fire of London. You could use true or false answers, fact answers, guess the number answers or come up with your own ideas. Challenge: Can you think of a way to present your quiz to your class friends?</p>
